#### THE THREE R'S-REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE

## Baltimore County has a new, improved, and easier way to recvcle!

- It's weekly. It's combined. No more sorting. No more waiting two weeks between paper and plastic.
- Use a box, a trash can, or string- but NO PLASTIC BAGS!
- Instead of trashing all those cardboard boxes, diaper boxes, soda and beer cartons, bottles and cans-RECYCLE!
- But wait, there's more.... Instead of recycling plastics with the numbers 1 to 3 on the bottom of the item, we can now recycle items with numbers 1 to 7 inside the triangle on the bottom.
- Empty aerosol cans can now be recycled. So can aluminum pans, milk and juice cartons, and ice cream containers.
- See how your regular trash is reduced.

It is very frustrating to see lots of trash and so little recycling.

Please contact us for information on how to start and/or increase your recycling habits.

#### DID YOU KNOW...

- There is an Architectural Board. Forms are on our website for improvements, and are needed for things including: storm doors, new decks, and windows.
- ALL pets must to be on a leash. Both are requirements of Baltimore County. Thank you for cleaning up after your pet.
- There are specific paint colors to comply with the architectural standards. They are listed on our website and are available only through Duron or Sherwin Williams. The name of the paint may have changed, but the color remains the same.
- The Perry Hall Improvement Association is a wonderful resource. Meetings might involve reviewing the county plan, or having a discussion with our county councilmen. A special thanks to David Marks for his support.
- A number of people are dumping their yard waste in the common areas and behind the guard rails near the storm water management pond. It's illegal!! And unacceptable.

## LIKE A GOOD NEIGHBOR...

- Please put your trash out after 6:00 PM. Imagine if your house faces the trash pile?
   This is Baltimore County law.
- Please retrieve your trash cans in a timely fashion.
- Slow down-especially while driving through the courts.
- Traffic Flow-when traveling north on Belair Road, you can only enter the development on Cedarside Drive (the second entrance). When leaving the development and going northbound, a left hand turn can only be made from Cedarside Drive.
- Be considerate. If you have more than two cars, be considerate about where you park. It
  affects everyone. Parking spots are not assigned. They belong to the County; hence, that the
  HOA Board cannot resolve parking disputes.

You may want to consider calling a reputable roofer to take a free peek at your roof. Many houses have had their roofs replaced. Do you have water spots on your walls or in your attic? Are some of your shingles missing? Don't ignore what you may not see.
